

cer team.


Last year's team was coming off the first-ever District 11 title, and with a majority of the team returning for 2024, hopes are high for a repeat performance.


while the girls were mostly young and inexperienced, but showed improvement consistently as the season progressed."

Bleam said this year's team is plagued by unusually low numbers so the girls are using the preseason to prepart for a season that will include several challenges as a result.


"Many young players will need to mature quickly as they will need to quickly adapt to the varsity level," Bleam said.




